Evening Lecture by Prof. Jamie Ellis

An evening lecture has been arranged with Prof. Jamie Ellis during his UK lecture tour. The date is **Tuesday 4th April** at the Leconfield Hall, Market Square, Petworth, GU28 0AH.

His lecture is entitled 'The amazing honey bee: design and function'. Jamie Ellis is the Gahan Associate Professor of Entomology in the Department of Entomology and Nematology at the University of Flori-



da, USA. He has a BS degree in Biology from the University of Georgia and a PhD in Entomology from Rhodes University in South Africa. At the University of Florida, Jamie has responsibilities in extension, instruction and research. Regarding his extension work, Jamie created the African Bee Extension and Education Program, the UF, South Florida, and Caribbean Bee Colleges, and the UF Master Beekeeper Program. As an instructor, Jamie supervises PhD and masters students in addition to offering an online beekeeping course. Currently, Jamie and his team have over 30 active research projects in the fields of honeybee husbandry, conservation and ecology, and integrated crop pollination. Jamie is also a trustee of the International Bee Research Association.

The evening lecture will start at 7:30pm sharp so please be in your seats no later than 7:20pm. All welcome and entry is free to WSBKA members and just £5 to non-members.

Melvyn's Missive

Our new Chairman, Melvyn Essen introduces himself to County News readers

I would like to introduce myself. For the last six years I have been Chairman of Central Sussex and also Apiary Coordinator - now I am only the latter, apart from organising our introductory course in the spring.

It all started by reporting a swarm in 2005 to a beekeeper, Leslie Brooks, who was on the local council's list of swarm collectors. The swarm was in the garden where I work, I still work there now but part time. It was interesting watching the way the bees arrived and decided to cluster in a crab apple tree. It was a large swarm and I supplied Leslie with a pair of steps which I helped to steady. Leslie saw I was interested and asked if I would like to come along to the training apiary one Saturday morning, I said yes and that was it!

In the spring of 2006 I ordered a nuc which cost me £70. At the same time I was invited to join two beekeepers, Syd Weller and his

son-in-law, John Hubbard. They had about 10 - 12 colonies in two apiaries and using the Snelgrove system had some large colonies. It was quite daunting to start with working with double brood boxes but my confidence grew with Syd and John's help. The Snelgrove system was very interesting to witness and took some time to understand which entrance to open and which to close after queen cells had been found and the two brood boxes were separated. The honey was divided into three so I had a lot of honey to store and jar. I had some great experiences for a few years.

I took the BBKA Basic Assessment in 2007 and General Husbandry in 2011.

I hope to see you at the Jamie Ellis lecture on the 4th April in Petworth.

ReViVe Update

Members will be aware that along with 60 other beekeeping associations and divisions your County Association is co-funding the ReViVe research project into expanding the mechanism by which some honeybee colonies are able to live in conjunction with high levels of *Varroa*.



£40,000 of funding is being provided over three years into this work led by Dr Declan Schroeder of Plymouth MBA and Prof. Stephen Martin of the University of Salford. You'll recall that Steve spoke to us at our Convention in February.

An update on the project progress is now available from the team. However, we have been asked not to post this information on the internet as it is part of their submission for peer review at the moment. It is however available to members on request.
